#### HISTORY OF ASPACI

The Australasian and South Pacific Association of Collision Investigators (ASPACI) was formed in 1992 at a meeting in Melbourne of Police Crash Investigators from all Australian States, New Zealand and several South Pacific countries. That inaugural meeting was sponsored by Monash University. Since that time membership has been offered to any person having an interest in Traffic Crash Investigation. ASPACI now has members throughout the world involved in road safety and traffic crash investigation and from that informal beginning the AIRIL Conferences were born, which have since travelled to South Africa and Canada (and to be held in Britain in 2003). Those conferences and the World Reconstruction Expo (held in Texas USA in 2000) have been sponsored in part by

ASPACI and play a vital role in the education of safety experts and traffic crash investigators. Since its formation ASPACI members have presented papers at various conferences throughout the world. The Association was formed to provide a forum for the dissemination of information, education and training of members in areas of road and vehicle safety, and the investigation and reconstruction of traffic crashes. The newsletter 'MOMENTUM' is the official publication of the Association.

#### CONFERENCE AIM

Friction is one of those glorious intangibles that the investigator or reconstructionist uses almost daily in his collision analysis deliberations.

From the simple speed to stop analysis to complex momentum calculations, the determination of an appropriate figure for friction is paramount. Any disagreement between reconstructionists is likely to be about the proper or appropriate friction figure as much as anything else.

Within the field of accident investigation and reconstruction there has probably been more testing and attempts at validating appropriate friction values than for any other parameter. Notwithstanding this inordinate amount of testing questions still arise and disagreements still occur within the reconstruction community about the appropriate figure to be used.

The aim of this conference is to further that testing, providing additional input into the significant database that exists. The aim is to provide further information on the appropriate friction rates for:

- Motor cycles sliding on their side
- Commercial vehicles skidding
- Appropriate friction value for yawing on selected surfaces
- Vehicles rolling over

Where possible this conference will provide a 'hands-on' approach so that delegates themselves will be able to gather and document information provided as a result of the testing.

The field day at Mallala racetrack will include an evaluation of friction coefficients or drag factors used by investigators and reconstructionists in their everyday deliberations. It will include, but is not necessarily limited to:

#### **Dr Richard Lambourn**

Investigations and Risk Management Consultant, UK

Principal Consultant in the Investigations and Risk Management Group at the UK's Transport Research Laboratory, specialising in road accident reconstruction. From 1973 to 1996 Dr Lambourn worked at the Metropolitan Police Forensic Science Laboratory in London. Throughout his career, he has advised police, lawyers and insurers on the reconstruction of individual accidents, attending accident scenes and going to courts at all levels.
